Steve Jobs was born in San Francisco, California in 1955. His parents adopted him when he was a baby. They were not rich and he grew up in small house in a suburb. In 1966, he went to high school, where he met Steve Wozniak. They later started a company called Apple together. In 1972, Steve Jobs joined Reed College in Portland, Oregon for a short time, but he didn't graduate. In 1974, he travelled around India before returning to the USA.

Man: There are eight planets in our solar system which orbit around the Sun. We can divide the solar system into two parts. The inner system, closest to the Sun, has Mercury, Venus, Earth and Mars. We call them the terrestrial planets. They have solid rocky surfaces. The outer system, furthest from the Sun, has Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune. We call them the gas giants. Pluto is beyond Neptune. Scientists do not think it is a planet. The asteroid belt is between these two systems. It contains thousands of pieces of rock.

Jupiter is the largest planet in our solar system. It is about 300 times the size of the Earth. Jupiter is named after the Roman sky god. The ancient Greeks knew him as Zeus. It takes Jupiter 11.9 Earth years to orbit around the Sun, but its day is much shorter. It is only 9.84 hours. Jupiter is the stormiest planet. It is made of thick gases, such as helium and methane. Jupiter has 64 moons. The famous scientist, Galileo, was the first person to discover the moons.

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Narrator: 4
Mercury is the smallest planet in the solar system. It is closest to the Sun, but it is not the hottest planet. Venus is much hotter than Mercury. It looks similar to the Earth's moon. There are a lot of craters and rocky mountains on the surface. Mercury orbits the Sun more quickly than the Earth. It takes only 88 days. Mercury is the name of the Roman messenger god. Mercury has no moons. It is also completely dry. There is no possibility of life on Mercury.
